

Hamersley Habitat Thrives

Creating the Hamersley Habitat Community Garden (HHCG) has been a real group effort. To help get the project underway, the City contributed \$20,000 from its Community Food Grants program. The funding paid for a new shed and pergola as well as water connection and soil for initial garden beds.

Since taking shape earlier this year, the community garden has been boosted by the efforts of three local schools during Arbor Day plantings. Volunteers including Cr Andrew Guilfoyle and more than 120 students from East Hamersley and Glendale primary schools and Warwick Senior High School all took part in the planting day. Most recently, hundreds of reclaimed pavers have found a new home as brick paths around the community garden.
